### **Subject:** COSLA Awards

## 1. Purpose

This report informs Members of the projects, within the Department of Education and Cultural Services and in association with the other Council departments, put forward for COSLA Excellence Awards in 2006.

## 2. Background

2.1 The COSLA Excellence Awards recognise projects that have demonstrated excellence in service delivery within the categories listed below. The categories are used as a way of encouraging Local Government to look to improve service delivery by providing services that are well planned, focussed on what customers want, and are efficiently delivered and creative in concept.

The categories for this year's Awards programme are:

- Category 1 Service Improvement and Customer Needs
- Category 2 Advancing Community Well-being
- Category 3 Health Improvement
- Category 4 Innovative Use of Technology
- Category 5 'One to watch'
- Category 6 Securing a Workforce for the Future

#### 3. Main Issues

- 3.1 After a process of long leeting to meet the COSLA limit of 12 submissions per Council, four projects managed and delivered by the Department of Education and Cultural Services and one delivered in partnership with Housing, Regeneration and Environmental Services have been selected for submission to COSLA.
- 3.2 Applications covering three categories of Advancing Community Well Being, Health Improvement and One to Watch have been submitted to COSLA from the Department. (See Table 1)

COSLA Awards Category 2 Advancing Community Well-being	The Pulse The Pulse is a programme with a rich mix of urban arts; design, hip hop, DJing, film-making and various sporting activities including skateboarding, BMX-ing, gym sessions and football. These activities are targeted at areas with high crime statistics and came about as a result of young people saying they have nothing to do on a Friday night.	Arts and Education Team
	Bookstart/Early Literacies Project (www.bookstart.co.uk/) Bookstart is a National Programme, funded by the Scottish Executive, which provides free packs of books to babies and guidance materials for parents and carers. It promotes a life-long love of books and is based on the principle that every child in the UK should enjoy and benefit from books from as early an age as possible.  The Bookstart project is being delivered in tandem with the Early Intervention scheme both targeted at improving the levels of literacy of children.	Libraries and Early Intervention Teams
Category 3 Health Improvement	To deliver an extensive programme of sport and physical activity, targeting young people residing in Social Inclusion Partnership areas within West Dunbartonshire. All sports programmes are free to participants. The approach is innovative in that West Dunbartonshire is the <u>first</u> sports development unit in Scotland to deliver sports sessions within local authority Early Years and Childcare Centres.	Sport Development
Category 5 'One to watch'	The PUDO Project The PUDO Project is pilot research with partners into the methods which will be used to conduct health and safety assessments of school bus pick-up points and give consideration to the hazards associated with such points.	Inclusion Team
