Subject: Professional Learning and Leadership Policy

1. Purpose

1.1 This report informs members about changes and developments to Professional Learning and Leadership in Educational Services as a result of the report "Teaching Scotland's Future: Report of a Review of Teacher Education in Scotland" (2011).

2. Recommendations:

- **2.1** Committee is recommended to:
 - (1) note the content of this report and the appendices; and
 - (2) endorse the approaches outlined to enhance professional learning and leadership.

3. Background

- **3.1** "Teaching Scotland's Future" was published in 2011 with a suite of recommendations aimed at long term and sustained improvement to impact on the quality of children's learning. http://www.scotland.gov.uk/Publications/2011/01/13092132/0
- **3.2** The report recognised the importance of high quality, career-long professional learning for all teachers. This begins when student teachers begin the early phase of teacher education to the end of their careers.
- 3.3 The General Teaching Council for Scotland (GTCS) has developed revised standards for Career-long Professional Learning and Standards for Leadership and Management. These come into effect in August 2013. "Teaching Scotland's Future affirmed the need to revise the Professional Standards. <u>http://www.gtcs.org.uk/standards/standards.aspx</u>
- **3.4** Educational Services have been involved in national work since the publication of Teaching Scotland's Future to develop our capacity to implement the recommendations.
- **3.5** The Professional Update paper was agreed at Local Negotiating Committee for Teachers (LNCT) Committee in June 2013.

4. Main Issues

- **4.1** In November 2011 Educational Services was invited to take part in the Strategic Leadership Development Programme. This was a collaborative project led by Association of Directors of Education (ADES), the Virtual Staff College Scotland and the National Continuing Professional Development (CPD) Team.
- **4.2** The work undertaken resulted in one of our Primary Head Teachers being seconded (0.4 FTE) to further develop Educational Services implementation of the recommendations contained in Teaching Scotland's Future.
- **4.3** Educational Services is now in the position to implement the Professional Learning and Leadership Policy (Appendix 1) and the Framework Model (Appendix 2).
- **4.4** The policy outlines West Dunbartonshire's commitment to raising standards of attainment through a highly skilled workforce and it reflects recommendations from Teaching Scotland's Future and guidance from GTCS.

5. People Implications

- **5.1** Support and communications will be established to ensure staff understand their responsibilities within the new professional standards.
- **5.2** The LNCT sub group will discuss all emerging issues as the policy is implemented.
- **5.3** The issue of Professional Learning for supply teachers is being addressed to ensure opportunities are available.

6. Financial Implications

6.1 The implementation of the policy will be funded from within existing Education Services budgets.

7. Risk Analysis

7.1 Failure to comply with GTCS Professional Up-date could result in teachers no longer being eligible to teach.

8. Equalities, Health & Human Rights Impact Assessment

8.1 No issues were identified in a screening for potential equality impact of this report.

9. Consultation

9.1 Head Teachers, Quality Improvement Officers and Team Leaders have been consulted with regarding the Professional Learning and Leadership Policy.
