CIVIC GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT 1982 PART V – PUBLIC PROCESSIONS, POLICE, PUBLIC ORDER AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE (SCOTLAND) ACT 2006, NOTICE OF PROPOSAL TO HOLD A PUBLIC PROCESSION: PROTESTANT MARTYRS (CLYDEBANK) LOYAL ORANGE LODGE NO 2000

A report was submitted by the Strategic Lead – Regulatory concerning a Notice of Proposal to hold a Public Procession submitted by Mr Cameron Russell on behalf of the Protestant Martyrs (Clydebank) Loyal Orange Lodge No. 2000.

The Section Head (Licensing) advised the Committee that Police Scotland had withdrawn their objection to the notification. The objection was based on there being no Temporary Traffic Regulation Order (TTRO) in place for a pre-planned event and was subsequently withdrawn prior to the meeting of the Committee. A submission by Mr MacLean was circulated to those Members present. Mr McLean was then heard in terms of the Notice of Proposal to hold a Public Procession.

After discussion and having heard the Section Head (Licensing) in further explanation of the report, the Committee noted that there was no objection to the notification for the Protestant Martyrs (Clydebank) Loyal Orange Lodge No. 2000 to hold a public procession on Saturday 17 March 2018.
