Subject: Planning appeal decision relating to the erection of a conservatory at 5 Parkhall Terrace, Clydebank (DC10/220/HOU).

1. Purpose

1.1 This report advises the Committee of the outcome of a planning appeal.

2. Background

2.1 An application for full planning permission for the erection of a conservatory was refused by Planning Committee on 7 September 2010. The application was refused on grounds that the proposal would detract from the amenity of neighbouring homes by reason of its scale, height, overlooking, overshadowing and impact upon servicing of neighbouring properties.

3. Main Issues

3.1 The appeal was dealt with by way of written submissions. The Reporter considered that in no way could the conservatory adversely affect the amenity of the area, including the flat directly above. In addition he noted that there were no planning grounds for resisting the ridged roof design of the conservatory. He fully endorsed the advice which planning officers put to the Planning Committee which recommended approval of the application. Overall, the Reporter was satisfied that the proposal complied with the local plan and was an acceptable form of development at this location. Accordingly the appeal was upheld and planning permission granted unconditionally.
