TAXI ACCESSIBILITY IN THE DUMBARTON AND VALE OF LEVEN AREA

- With reference to the Minutes of the Meeting of the Licensing Committee held on 3 November 2004, a further report was submitted by the Head of Legal and Administrative Services on the issue of taxi accessibility within the Dumbarton and Vale of Leven Taxi Licensing Zone.
- A wheelchair accessible model of the Fiat Doblo (Freedom) was on display outside the Council Chambers, Clydebank Town Hall on the morning of the meeting for Members' inspection.
- In this respect, Mr Alec Hazlet of Cab Direct was in attendance at the meeting to answer any questions in respect of the Fiat Doblo (Freedom) and the Ford Tourneo Connect for use as wheelchair accessible taxis.
- The Principal Solicitor was heard in further explanation of the background to the report. After discussion and having heard Mr Hazlet in answer to Members' questions, the Committee agreed:-
 - (a) to approve the use of the Fiat Doblo (Freedom) and the Ford Tourneo Connect as wheelchair accessible taxis;
 - (b) that the issue of wheelchair accessible taxis as detailed in paragraph 2.1 of the report to Committee on 3 November 2004 be continued to the Council meeting on Wednesday, 24 November 2004 if possible; and

(c) to thank Mr Hazlet of Cab Direct for his very informative contribution to the meeting.

PRIVATE HIRE CAR LICENSING – APPROVED PASSENGER CARRYING CAPACITY

- With reference to the Minutes of the Meeting of the Licensing Committee held on 3 November 2004, a report was resubmitted by the Head of Legal and Administrative Services concerning the possibility of increasing the approved maximum passenger carrying capacity for private hire cars licensed by this Authority.
