Subject: Grant Applications

1. Purpose

1.1 The purpose of this report is to provide information on grant applications and to recommend grants to voluntary organisations from the Alexander Cross Cameron Trust Fund.

2. Recommendations

2.1 The Committee is asked to agree the recommendations as detailed in the Appendix.

3. Background

- Alexander Cross Cameron Fund grants are administered by the West Dunbartonshire Council and are reported to the Committee as and when applications are received. The Fund was set up for the benefit of the people of Clydebank to assist those in need by reason of age, ill health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage.
- 3.2 The value of fund as at 31st March 2017 is £154,964. This includes interest received during 2016/17 of £569.

4.1 Grant Applications

Three applications have been received for funding however one of the applications is not complete enough for officers to make a recommendation at this stage. Details of the remaining two applications are shown in Appendix A and Members should note that an amount of up to £312 is being recommended.
