

Quality indicators help pre-school centres, education authorities and inspectors to judge what is good and what needs to be improved in the work of the pre-school centre. You can find these quality indicators in the publication *Child at the Centre*². Following our inspection of each pre-school centre, the Scottish Government gathers evaluations of three important quality indicators to keep track of how well all Scottish pre-school centres are doing.

Here are the evaluations for **Children’s Hour Nursery**

Improvements in performance	very good
Children’s experiences	very good
Meeting learning needs	very good

We also evaluated the following aspects of the work of the pre-school centre

The curriculum	good
Improvement through self-evaluation	good

At the last inspection that was conducted by the Care Inspectorate (Social Care and Social Work Improvement Scotland, SCSWIS), there were three recommendations. All recommendations have since been addressed.
