Subject: Receipt of an appeal in relation to the refusal of application DC13/168 for the retrospective erection of a rear garden fence and access gate at 81 Kirk Crescent Old Kilpatrick.

1. Purpose

1.1 This report advises the Committee of the submission of a planning appeal.

2. Recommendations

2.1 That the Committee note the receipt of this appeal.

3. Background

3.1 A retrospective application for the erection of a rear garden fence and access gate was refused by the Planning Committee on 28 August 2013. The application was refused on the grounds that the new fence did not reflect the established boundary treatments along the lane leading to Old Kilpatrick Cemetery, and that it set an unacceptable precedent for replacing the original metal railings and introducing inappropriate domestic access onto the lane. Accordingly, the proposal was considered to be contrary to Policy H5 of the West Dunbartonshire Local Plan 2010.

4. Main Issues

4.1 An appeal against the refusal of planning permission has been lodged with Scottish Ministers. The appellant has requested the appeal be dealt with by way of a site visit and written submissions.
