Subject: Construction of house behind Torbeg Cottage, Glasgow Road, Hardgate, Clydebank.

1. Purpose

1.1 To advise the Committee of the withdrawal of the complaint concerning the failure to comply with a condition in relation to the construction of a new house behind Torbeg Cottage, Glasgow Road, Hardgate and to recommend that no further action is taken on this matter.

The complainant was concerned that the erection of the fencing may result in the loss of dry-stane dyke that was part of the heritage of Clydebank and has requested that the Council does not pursue the matter any further.
