
Addison/Lawless Wedding Party

We enclose an application for an extension of hours. We appreciate that the application is outwith your normal policy in such situations and would respectfully submit that the circumstances of this application would justify on this occasion departure from that policy. The parties involved in the wedding are largely based in the Kilmarnock area, with fifteen travelling from North America, several from Dubai and a number from France and the South of England. The majority by far of the guests will be residing in accommodation provided by the Cameron House Organisation. While most of these will be resident at Cameron House Hotel itself and as such will enjoy the privileges of round the clock hotel service automatically, others have booked accommodation through the same organisation in either the time share lodges, at Cameron House or in the accommodation in the associated facility at Carrick Golf Club situated a short distance away from the hotel. These guests however do not enjoy the privileges of hotel guests.

While the availability of a range of accommodation of this nature is popular with the organisers of and guests involved in a variety of social functions based at Cameron House Hotel, the disadvantage is that as in this case the celebrations of the wedding party will be interrupted as far as they are concerned by the normal terminal hour which requires them to leave while the celebrations for the others who are resident in the hotel are ongoing. This is an unusual element and disruptive disadvantage in what is otherwise an excellent availability of choice of accommodation particularly for guests coming from abroad and which features largely in the choice by many bridal parties from abroad of the outstanding facilities at a hotel which enjoys a high reputation worldwide.
