# Subject: Proposals on spend of additional funds allocated by the Scottish Executive

## 1. Purpose

**1.1** To inform members of the current status of the spending plans for the allocation of additional funds by the Scottish Executive.

#### 2. Background

- 2.1 The Scottish Executive provided West Dunbartonshire Education and Cultural Services with an additional £700,000 to spend on schools with a set of specific criteria (Appendix 1).
- **2.2** At a headteacher meeting in late November, agreement was reached that a proportion of the allocation would be downloaded to schools and the remainder would be directed strategically by the department to upgrade computer stock and infrastructure across the council.
- **2.3** Funds were downloaded on a pro rata basis to schools and centres in December. The remaining funds, totally just under £500,000 will be spent strategically by the department.

## 3. Main Issues

- **3.1** A working group of headteachers will report in mid January to secure agreement on a preferred computer platform for future purchases. Currently there is a mixed platform of PC and Applemac computers used mainly by primary schools. It is anticipated that agreement will be reached on a common platform for all council establishments.
- **3.2** There is a disparity in the broadband connectivity for schools across the council. If West Dunbartonshire is to be able to access the national schools' digital network, then an upgrade to a higher level of connectivity will be necessary in some areas of the council.
- **3.3** Schools across the council have varying levels of up to date computer hardware. A strategic view of a minimum requirement for digital connectivity will be required. Schools will benefit from the additional funds in relation to their upgrade needs and current requirements.

## 4. Main Points for Action:

- **4.1** Following an appraisal of the available options, it has been determined that allocation of the remaining funds not already made available to schools will be based on:
  - 1. The decisions made by the working group on the preferred computer platform.
  - 2. The costs of broadband connectivity to ensure access to the digital network for all establishments.
  - 3. The numbers of hardware systems and additional software identified to provide an allocation to each school.
- **4.2** Given the timescales involved, authority is sought to commence procurement and to put in place the necessary contracts to ensure maximisation of spend, once the above decisions have been made.

## 5. Personnel Issues

**5.1** The report has no implications for personnel.

## 6. Risk Analysis

6.1 There are no risk analysis implications.

### 7. Financial Implications

**7.1** The delegated funds from the Scottish Executive will finance all proposals. Spending decisions will made in accordance with council's financial regulations and standing orders.

#### 8. Conclusion

**8.1** The additional funds provided by the Scottish Executive have already provided local decision making on resource purchases for schools. The remaining funds of just under £500,000 will be spend strategically to the benefit of all schools and to upgrade computer provision across the council.

#### 9. Recommendations

  - (b) to approve the procurement of the appropriate goods, services and works once the final scope has been determined; and
  - (c) to seek a further report to committee advising on the final spend.

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
