Notes on Variances greater than £25,000

Corporate Services

Environmental Health £46,490 Fav This favourable variance is due to staffing vacancies together with savings anticipated on payments to other bodies (through dog kennelling & public analyst, which are both demand led budgets). There is also higher than anticipated income .

Human Resource & Organisational Development £30.030 Fav This favourable variance is due to the recent restructure of the service and some staffing vacancies currently held.

Educational Services

Schools – Primarv

The costs of teacher cover and the average salary costs paid are lower than anticipated.

Schools – Secondary

The costs of teacher cover and the promoted structure costs are lower than anticipated.

Schools – Special

The costs of heating oil, transport, unplanned property repairs and external costs of special education were greater than anticipated.

Outdoor Education

The catering costs are higher than anticipated due to the remote location of the premises and income is lower than expected due to fewer weekend and concurrent courses.

Pre-Five Service

Income is lower due to the lower than anticipated number of users in nurseries following increases in user charges.

Residential Schools

£59,370 Fav This favourable variance is due to no secure placements being required in 2011/12 to date. Budget was retained in the event that this is unsustainable.

Other Services - Young People

The main reason for this favourable variance is employee cost savings due to vacancies and lower than anticipated taxi costs.

£52,300 Fav Residential Accommodation - Elderly This favourable variance has arisen as a lower number of clients are being placed in care than anticipated.

Residential Accommodation - Learning Disability £79,120 Adv Increased client need and revised package costs has resulted in an adverse variance at this stage.

Home Help Service

£44,030 Fav A favourable variance has arisen in relation to a reduction in the use of premium rate overtime.

Housing, Environmental and Economic Development Services

Grounds Maintenance & Street Cleaning Client

Considerable overtime was undertaken by this service following the strong winds on 24 May 2011. This expenditure on clear-up works is outwith the normal subsidy paid by the client account to the trading operation.

Leisure Services Client

£131,620 Adv This adverse variance is largely due to a fall in Cosmo Club membership with declines also evident across other activities.

Homeless Persons

This favourable variance is mainly due to the continuing high occupancy of the temporary units.

Anti Social Behaviour

This adverse variance is caused primarily by the continuation of the CCTV service inherited by the department last June.
