Additional Comments

- Agendas should not be restricted
- Representatives sometimes have to present views from their groups which aren't their own personal views (conflict)
- Membership should be clear (e.g. members and substitutes, who can speak and when) and kept up to date
- This process was not accessible to everyone and was driven by perceptions
- Fewer elected members should be involved

Priority: Accountability

- Community representatives have to communicate with their groups and provide a balanced account of their views at meetings
- Officials and elected members have to provide information which is clear and accurate
