DECLARATION OF INTEREST

Councillors Mooney declared a non-financial interest in the item of business entitled 'Application for Provisional Premises Licence – 9 Radnor Street, Clydebank', being a member of the West Dunbartonshire Community Health and Care Partnership, given that an objection had been submitted in relation to the applications by a sub-group of the West Dunbartonshire Alcohol and Drug Partnership. Councillor Mooney intimated that he would remain in the meeting during consideration of the item of the business and would take part in any decisions reached by the Board.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

**CONTINUED APPLICATION FOR VARIATION OF PREMISES
LICENCE IN TERMS OF THE LICENSING (SCOTLAND) ACT
2005 - CASA ITALIA, 1 MONTROSE STREET, CLYDEBANK G81 2LP**

A continued application for Variation of Premises Licence in respect of Casa Italia, 1 Montrose Street, Clydebank G81 2LP was submitted for consideration.

It was noted:-

- (a) that Mr Robin Morton, agent, was in attendance on behalf of the applicant and was accompanied by representatives of the applicant, Mr Colin Beattie, Mr Alasdair Moore and Ms Yvonne Latta; and
- (b) that Mr Beck, a local resident, and Councillor Denis Agnew were in attendance on behalf of the objectors to the application.

The Board heard from Mr Morton in support of the application and in relation to progress on the development of a suitable noise control strategy at the above premises. Mr Morton addressed the Board on steps taken to limit noise at the premises as recommended by the applicant's independent Noise Impact Assessors, Robin MacKenzie Partnership, in their progress report dated 5 March 2015, a copy of which was provided to both the Members of the Board and the objectors at the meeting.

Mr John Stevenson, Section Head, and Mr Pat Hoey, Team Leader, Environmental Health, were then heard in support of the recommendations made by the applicant's Noise Impact Assessors and were satisfied that the measures undertaken would be sufficient to avoid noise intrusion to neighbouring properties.

Mr Clyde, LSO, was then heard in relation to the application and advised that if granted, conditions would specify that live entertainment could only occur during pre-booked and ticketed functions at the premises.

Mr Beck, a local resident, was then heard in support of his objection in relation to noise nuisance emanating from the premises.

Councillor Agnew was also heard in support of his objection to the application.

Following consideration of all matters before the Board, Councillor McGinty, moved:-

That the application be granted with the conditions recommended by the LSO and on the provision that a positive outcome is provided by the Council's Environmental Health Team in relation to testing of the noise impact assessment.

LSO recommendations in relation to variation of conditions to which the licence is subject (other than those to which the licence is subject by virtue of Section 27(1)):-

Section 3(a) of application – referring to alteration/deletion of conditions

"Amend to allow patrons attending functions to consume alcohol after meal" – No Comment from LSO.

"Re licence condition 4, amend to allow occasional live music" – LSO recommends that a condition be added limiting this occurrence to only be permissible during a pre-booked or ticketed function.

"Delete licence condition 7 to allow patrons consuming meals in an approved external area to have alcohol as ancillary thereto" – LSO recommends a condition binding the consumption of alcohol outside the premises to the consumption of food.

Section 3(a) of application – referring to variation of the information contained in the operating plan

5(g) – "add live performances" – LSO recommends that a condition be added limiting this occurrence to only be permissible during a pre-booked or ticketed function.

"Add small area for musicians" – LSO comment as per request to amend condition 4 limiting this occurrence to only be permissible during a pre-booked or ticketed function.

"Show area which can be used for dancing" – LSO recommends that a condition be added limiting this occurrence to only be permissible during a pre-booked or ticketed function.

As an amendment, Councillor Brown, moved:-

That the Board continues the application until a further noise impact assessment is carried out by the Council's Environmental Health Team.

On a vote being taken, one member voted for the amendment and three for the motion. The motion was accordingly declared carried.

Having heard the Clerk to the Licensing Board in clarification of the Board's decision, it was noted that the Board was of the view that if the Council's Noise Impact was positive, there would be no grounds to refuse the application.

DECIDED:

That the application be granted with the conditions recommended by the LSO and on the provision that a positive outcome is provided by the Council's Environmental Health Team in relation to noise impact assessment.

- (2) that having regard to the number and capacity of licensed premises in the locality of Radnor Park, the Board considers that, if the application were to be granted, there would be overprovision of licensed premises in the locality in terms of the Board's Statement of Licensing Policy.

**PREMISES REVIEW FOR EASTFIELD BOWLING CLUB,

In terms of Section 38(1) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act, the Licensing Board considered an Application for Review of a Premises Licence from the Chief Constable of Police Scotland in respect of the premises known as Eastfield Bowling Club, 127 Glasgow Road, Dumbarton G82 1RQ.

Mr John Duff, Designated Premises Manager and Mr Donald Beck, Club Secretary of Eastfield Bowling Club were heard on behalf of the Premises Licence Holder, Eastfield Bowling Club. Sergeant Quinn was heard of behalf of the Chief Constable, Police Scotland.

After consideration of all matters before the Board, it was agreed to hold that the grounds for preventing crime and disorder had been established.

Mr Beck and Mr Duff were then given the opportunity to address the Board on the issue of remedy at the premises.

After discussion, Councillor McGinty, moved:-

That a written warning letter, under Section 39(2)(a) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 and in terms of the licensing objective of preventing crime and disorder, be issued to the premises licence holder advising of the serious view that the Board takes of licencees who fail to comply with the law and to encourage a good relationship between the licence holder, the LSOs and Police Scotland to ensure that the premises is compliant with licensing legislation.

Thereafter, as an amendment, Councillor Brown moved:-

That given the circumstances surrounding the breach of legislation, the Board take no action against the licence holder.

On a vote being taken, 2 Members voted for the motion and 2 Members voted for the amendment. There being an equality of votes, Councillor Mooney, Chair used his casting vote in favour of the motion which was accordingly declared carried.

DECIDED:-

That a written warning letter, under Section 39(2)(a) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 and in terms of the licensing objective of preventing crime and disorder, be issued to the premises licence holder advising of the serious view that the Board takes of licencees who fail to comply with the law and to encourage a good relationship between the licence holder, the LSOs and Police Scotland to ensure that the premises is compliant with licensing legislation.

REVIEW OF PERSONAL LICENCE – MR JOHN DUFF

In terms of Section 83(7) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005, Members were requested to hold a Hearing to consider the Personal Licence held by Mr John Duff.

It was noted:-

- (a) that both the licence holder and a representative of Police Scotland had been invited to attend the meeting in order that a Hearing could take place; and

- (c) that Sergeant Quinn, Licensing Sergeant, was in attendance on behalf of the Chief Constable, Police Scotland.

DECIDED:-

Following consideration of all matters before the Board, it was agreed that no action be taken in relation to Mr Duff's Personal Licence.

LICENSING BOARD PROCEDURE NOTE

Applications with Objection(s)/Representation(s) in terms of Section 22 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005

The steps in the procedure are:-

1. Check whether applicant and/or agent and objectors are present. If there are a large number of objectors, a signing in sheet might be circulated around them.
2. If there are a large number of objectors, check who wants to speak. Advise them that all relevant and competent objections already submitted in writing will be fully considered. Also advise them that the Board is keen to avoid duplication of submissions. Invite objectors to appoint a spokesperson or spokespersons who can cover all of their objections.
3. Ask the applicant if there are any preliminary issues. This is the applicant's opportunity to object to objections. It is for the Board to decide whether an objection is vexatious or frivolous. The objector whose objection is being challenged should be asked for their comments.
4. Hear from Licensing Standards Officer and hear from Environmental Health and Planning if required.
5. Opportunity for applicant, then objectors, then Board Members to put questions to LSO and any other party as above.
6. Hear from objectors in turn.
7. Opportunity for applicant to ask questions of objectors through the Chair.
8. Opportunity for the Board to ask questions of objectors.

9. Hear from applicant or agent.
10. Opportunity for objectors to put questions to applicant through Chair, followed by questions from Board Members.
11. The LSO, followed by Police Scotland and thereafter the applicant and any objectors to be given an opportunity to sum up. No new material should be introduced at this stage.
12. Debate followed by decision.

NOTE – if there are any issues which the Board is concerned about (particularly issues which might result in a refusal) the Board should invited the applicant to address them on these issues.

LICENSING BOARD – REVIEW OF PREMISES/PERSONAL LICENCE**HEARING PROCEDURE NOTE**

The steps in the procedure are:-

1. Check who is present – Licence Holder, Agent, Police etc.
2. Check if the Licence Holder has received the letter of complaint from the Police
3. and the report from the Licensing Standards Officer (LSO).
4. Check if there are any preliminary issues.
5. Hear from Police Scotland.
6. Opportunity for the Licence Holder to ask questions to the Police, via the Chair.
7. Opportunity for Board Members and their advisor to ask questions to the Police.
8. Hear from Licensing Standards Officer.
9. Opportunity for the Licence Holder to ask questions to the LSO, via the Chair.
10. Opportunity for Board Members and their advisor to ask questions to the LSO.
11. Opportunity for Licence Holder to address the Board.
12. Board Members and their advisor may ask questions to the Licence Holder.
13. Board Members may ask questions of any party present.
14. The LSO, followed by Police Scotland and thereafter the applicant to be given an opportunity to sum up. No new material should be introduced at this stage.
15. Board debates and decides what to do.
(Note – if the Board moves to suspend the licence, it does not decide the period of suspension at this point.)
16. If the Board has decided to suspend the licence, the Licence Holder has an opportunity to address the Board on the period of suspension.
17. The Board decides on the period of suspension.



Subject: Extensions to Licensing Hours over the Festive Period**1. Purpose**

To propose a policy on the granting of Applications for Extended Hours over the 2015/2016 Festive Period in terms of Section 68 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005.

2. Recommendations**2.1 It is recommended;**

- (a) that the period in which applications will be considered for extended hours in respect of the 2015/2016 Festive Period should run from Friday, 18 December 2015 to Friday, 1 January 2016;
- (b) that the previous practice of allowing premises who have a separate function room in their premises extensions within the first two weeks of December should cease. Analysis of the applications for festive extensions in previous years has shown that no applications for extended hours within this period are ever submitted.
- (c) that applications for extended hours for the festive period from all holders of premises licences be permitted for the dates and hours as stated in Appendix table 1;
- (d) that premises licence holders without significant entertainment (i.e. Public houses, hotel bars and members 'clubs) may apply for extended hours to 3 am on Hogmanay on condition that last entry to the premises is 11pm and the event is pre-ticketed;
- (e) that authority for the granting of applications for extensions to licensing hours over the Festive Period is delegated to the Clerk to the Licensing Board, if the application accordance with the foregoing agreed recommendations;
- (f) that should applications for extended hours be submitted which fall outwith the agreed hours, or aforementioned recommendations, then any such applications will require to be submitted to the Board for consideration.

3. Background

- 3.1 In previous years the Licensing Board has agreed to relax its policy on the extension of opening hours for licensed premises over the Festive Period. In order to allow licence holders to plan entertainment programmes for the Festive Period as far in advance as possible, the Board normally determines the period during which the policy on the granting of extended hours may be relaxed in respect of the forthcoming Festive Period and agrees the additional hours which may be approved. The proposal for this year reflects previous decisions taken by the Board.
- 3.2 A Board decision made on 11 September 2012 allowed premises licence holders without significant entertainment (i.e. Public houses, hotel bars and members' clubs) to apply to 3 am on Hogmanay on condition that last entry to the premises would be 11pm. The event also had to be pre-ticketed.
- 3.3 In previous years the period for extension normally commenced from the first weekend December to accommodate for party nights within premises with separate function halls. Given the lack of applications for events of this type in previous years this option has been removed.

4. Main Issues

- 4.1 The Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 came into effect on 1 September 2009 and in terms of Section 68 of the Act, the Licensing Board may extend the licensed hours in respect of premises by such period as specified in an application by the holder of a premises licence or such other period as the Board may consider appropriate.
- 4.2 This proposal reflects the Licensing Board's decision in previous years. However it should be noted that the Licensing Forum's view on 4 June 2013 had been that a 2am extension on Hogmanay for premises not offering significant entertainment was sufficient. The Licensing Forum will be consulted on this matter at the meeting to be held on 2 June 2015 and their views will be made known at the Licensing Board on 16 June 2015.

5. People Implications

All extended hours applications should be processed by Officers of the Licensing Board without adverse impact on the service provided by the Licensing Board or the Licensing Team.

6. Financial Implications

The report will have a financial benefit to the licensed trade over the Festive Period.

7. Risk Analysis

There is no increased risk to the Council associated with the contents of this report.

8. Equalities, Health & Human Rights Impact Assessment (EIA)

No issues were identified in the screening for potential impact of this report.

9. Consultation

The Licensing Forum are to be consulted on 2 June 2015.

10. Strategic Assessment

There are no strategic implications and this report is in line with the Council's strategic priorities.
