

Quality indicators help pre-school centres, education authorities and inspectors to judge what is good and what needs to be improved in the work of the pre-school centre. You can find these quality indicators in the publication *Child at the Centre*². Following our inspection of each pre-school centre, the Scottish Government gathers evaluations of three important quality indicators to keep track of how well all Scottish pre-school centres are doing.

Here are the evaluations for **Clydebank Early Education and Childcare Centre**

Children's experiences	very good
Improvements in performance	good
Meeting learning needs	very good

We also evaluated the following aspects of the work of the pre-school centre

The curriculum	good
Improvement through self-evaluation	good

At the last inspection that was conducted by the Care Inspectorate (Social Care and Social Work Improvement Scotland, SCSWIS), there were 2 recommendations. All recommendations have since been addressed.
