A report was submitted by the Head of Legal, Administrative and Regulatory Services concerning an application for grant of a Temporary Street Trader's Licence (Employee) by the above named person.

After hearing the Principal Solicitor it was noted:-

- (a) that a letter had been received from the Chief Superintendent of the Police authority intimating an objection in relation to the application; the objection being based on convictions recorded against the applicant, which he had failed to disclose in his application, and a pending case against the applicant arising from his failure to disclose his convictions when making the application, as referred to in the report; and
- (b) that in view of the objection, the applicant and a representative of the Police authority had been invited to attend the meeting in order that a hearing may take place.

It was noted that Chief Inspector MacDonald and Sergeant Fulton were in attendance and the Committee heard Chief Inspector MacDonald in relation to the objection.

Thereafter the applicant was invited to come forward and he addressed the Committee in support of his application. After answering questions from Members the applicant returned to the public gallery.

Chief Inspector MacDonald also returned to the public gallery.

After consideration the Committee unanimously agreed that the application be refused on the grounds that the applicant was not a fit and proper person to hold the licence applied for having regard to the convictions recorded against him as detailed in the letter of objection to the application from the Police.
