GRIEVANCE APPEAL (REF: APP/04/06)

- The Appellants were represented by Charlie McDonald of the TGWU. The Department in which the Appellants were employed was represented by Raymond Lynch, Solicitor.

After the Committee had deliberated the matter in private, both parties were re-admitted to the meeting and advised that the Committee found that the Appellants had no entitlement to the bonus in question and therefore recommended that no action be taken by Management in relation to the grievance.
