Subject: Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Education: Report on Auchnacraig Early Education and Childcare Centre

1. Purpose

1.1 To inform Members of the inspection of Auchnacraig Early Education and Childcare Centre by Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Education (HMIe) and the subsequent report published by HMIe on 7 December 2011.

2. Background

Auchnacraig Early Education and Childcare Centre was inspected as part of a national sample of pre-school education and the subsequent report published by HMIE 7 December 2011 The inspection covered key aspects of the work of the Centre. It evaluated:

- How well children learn and achieve
- How well the pre-school centre supports children to develop and learn
- How well the pre-school centre improves the quality of its work

3. Main Issues

- **3.1** Members will note that HM Inspectors found the following key strengths:
 - Happy, motivated children who are growing in confidence as responsible learners.
 - The quality of children's learning experiences outdoors and in the forest school.
 - The inclusive nurturing environment for learning.
 - Strong and supportive partnerships with parents.
 - The focus on leadership for learning by the head of centre and staff team.
