The elimination of the test would remove that barrier, however, in so doing it may allow taxi drivers who do not have a working knowledge of the area. EIA756: The Council is permitted by the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 to test potential applicants for taxi and private hire car driver licenses of their local knowledge. Such a test may be a barrier to some groups however these barriers can be overcome by reasonable adjustments in the sitting of the test.
