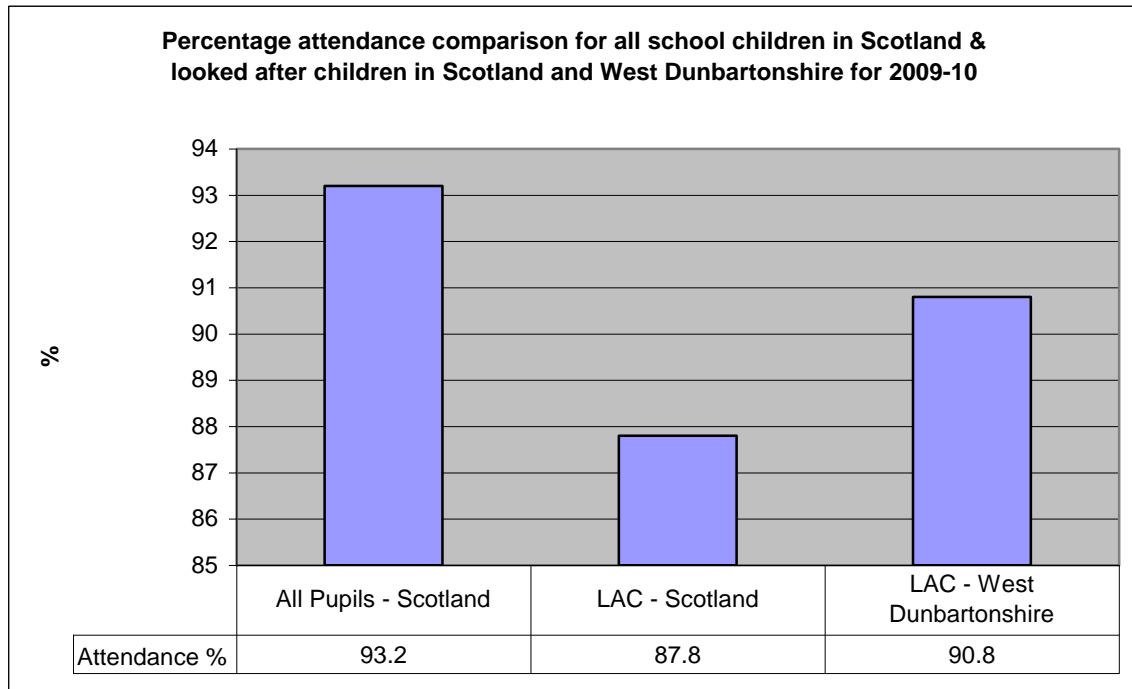




# **Educational Outcomes for Scotland's Looked After Children 2009-10 Analysis**

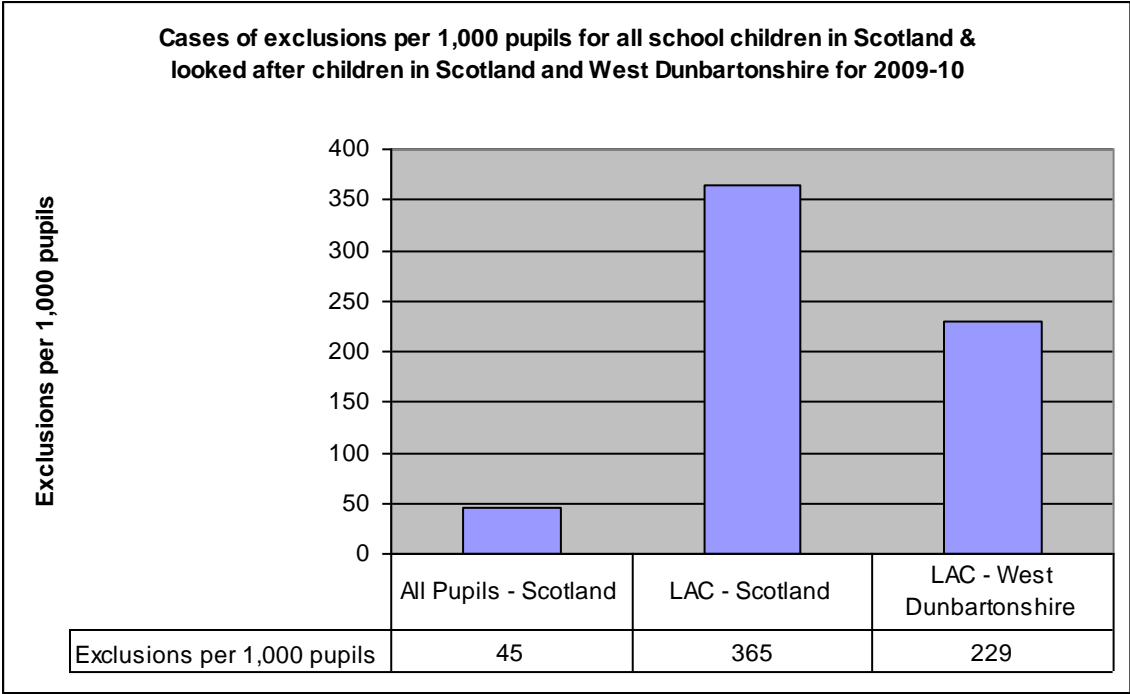
- Overall school attendance rate for looked after children from West Dunbartonshire was 3 per cent higher than the national rate of 87.8 per cent in 2009/10.
- Attendance rate for all school pupils in Scotland was 2.4 per cent higher than West Dunbartonshire looked after children.

- Overall exclusion rate for looked after children from West Dunbartonshire was lower by 136 per 1,000 than the national rate of 365 per 1,000 pupils.

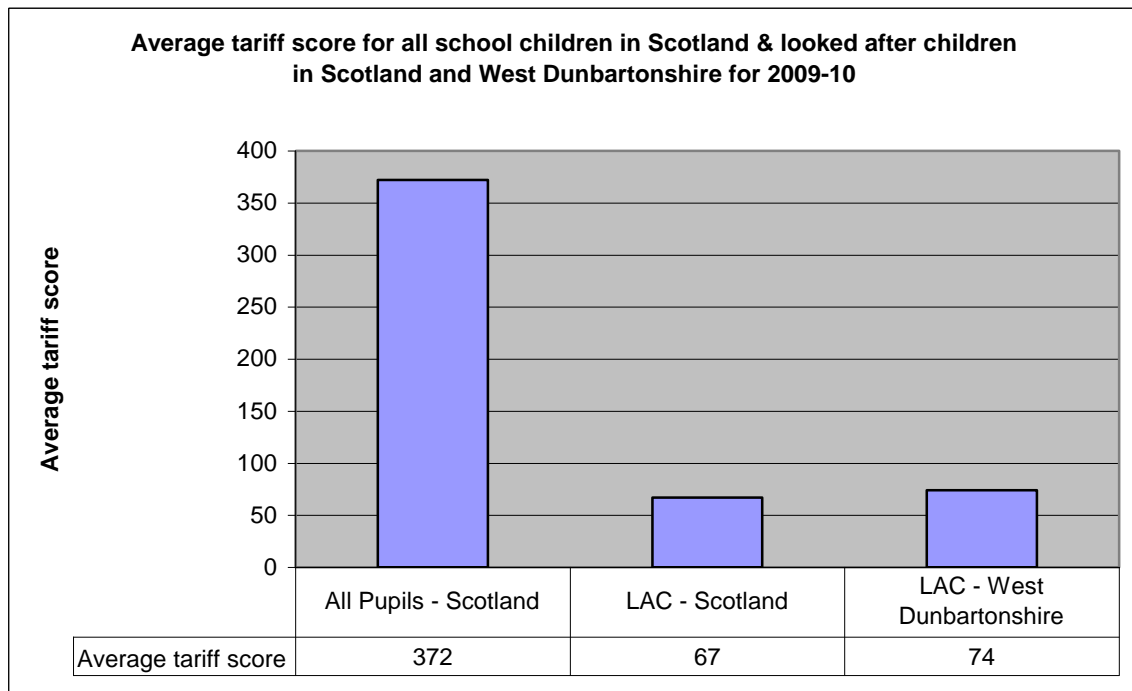

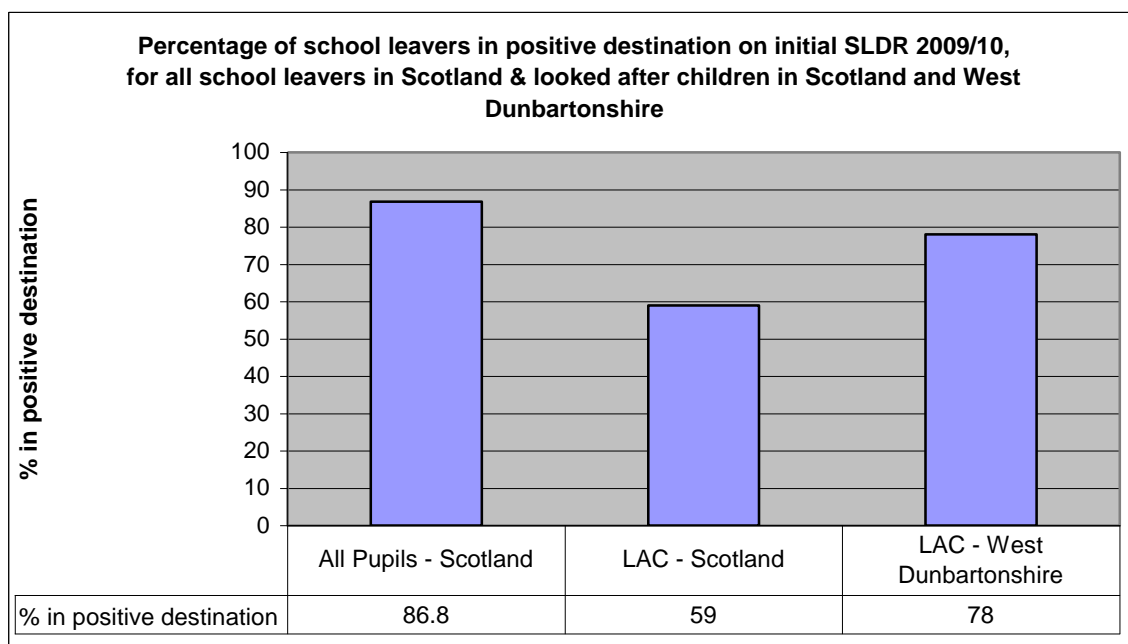

- Initial destination of looked after children from West Dunbartonshire in positive destination was 78 per cent compared to 59 per cent at the national level.

Note: Initial destination count was taken in September 2010. A follow up count was taken in March 2011 which showed 56 per cent of looked after children from West Dunbartonshire sustaining their positive destination. At the national level this figure was 44 per cent.
