Subject: Street Naming for New Development off Castle Street/Leven Street,
Dumbarton

- 1. Purpose
- **1.1** To allocate street names for a new housing development
- 2. Background
- 2.1 The development by Turnberry Homes, consists of 9 blocks of 3, 4 and 5 storey flats (201 No flats in total), 2 Blocks of Townhouses (8 No in total) and 33 detached dwellinghouses, all located on a vacant site which will be accessed from Castle Street & Leven Street, Dumbarton.
- **2.2** The site was formally occupied by the Denny Shipyard and was vacant/derelict immediately prior to the housing development commencing.
- 3. Main Issues
- The site requires 2 new roadways to be allocated names. Use of the former Denny Shipyard connection as the basis for street naming appears appropriate in this instance. Other than Dennystoun Forge, located elsewhere in Dumbarton, there are no other known links to the Denny name having been used for street naming purposes in Dumbarton.
