Subject: Review of Personal Licence – Mrs Tubassum Akbar

1. Purpose

- 1.1** This report provides information to assist the Board in considering the Review of the Personal Licence held by Mrs Tubassum Akbar given the decision of the Board at its meeting on 16 August 2011 to hold a Hearing to review the Personal Licence held by Mrs Akbar in terms of Section 84(3)(a) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005.

2. Background

- 2.1** At the meeting of the Licensing Board held on 16 August 2011, the Board considered an Application for Review of a Premises Licence from the Chief Constable of Strathclyde Police in relation to Mrs Tubassum Akbar, the licence holder in respect of 148 Montrose Street, Clydebank (a copy of the Police letter is attached as Appendix 1).
- 2.2** During the course of the Review Hearing on 16 August 2011, the Board also heard from Peter Clyde, Licensing Standards Officer, in terms of his report dated 1 August 2011 (a copy of which is attached as Appendix 2).
- 2.3** At the Hearing on 16 August 2011, the Board unanimously agreed:-
- (i) that the premises licence be suspended for a period of 4 months with the reprisal that should matters as regards the operation of the premises be remedied to the Board's satisfaction, then an application to revoke the suspension could be considered at the meeting of the Board on 8 November 2011; and
 - (ii) that the Board made a finding in terms of Section 84 (3)(a), that Mrs Akbar's conduct had been inconsistent with the crime and disorder objective and that a Hearing be held before West Dunbartonshire Licensing Board to consider the Personal Licence held by Mrs Akbar, at its next meeting on 8 November 2011.
- 2.4** A copy of the Excerpt Minutes of Meeting of the Licensing Board held on 16 August 2011, detailing the decision of the Board, is also provided for information (a copy of the excerpt is attached as Appendix 3).

3. Main Issues

- 3.1** In view of the decision of the Board, in terms of Section 84(3)(a) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005, to hold a Hearing to consider the Personal Licence held by Mrs Akbar, both Mrs Akbar and a representative of the Police authority have been invited to attend the meeting of the Board to be held on 8 November 2011.
- 3.2** The Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005, Section 142: Guidance for Licensing Boards and Local Authorities states that if following a hearing, the Licensing Board considers that a sanction is required against the personal licence holder then, depending on the circumstances, it can take one of the following actions:-
- Revoke the licence;
 - Suspend the licence for such period, not exceeding 6 months, as the Board considers appropriate; or
 - Endorse the personal licence
