GRIEVANCE APPEALS (REF: APP/06/06 AND APP/06/05)

- ⁹⁹⁵⁴ There were submitted background papers relating to Appeals which had been submitted to the Council in relation to grievances. There was also submitted a Note of the procedure to be followed at the Hearing of the Appeals.
- ⁹⁹⁵⁵ The Appellants were present and were represented by Michael Conroy of the GMB. The department in which the Appellants were employed was represented by Alistair Young, Solicitor.
- ⁹⁹⁵⁶ At the request of all parties, the Committee agreed that the two Appeals be heard together.
- ⁹⁹⁵⁷ Mr Conroy called the first Appellant (Ref: APP/06/06) as a witness. The first Appellant was questioned by Mr Conroy, Mr Young and Members of the Committee. Mr Conroy then called the second Appellant (Ref: APP/06/05) as a witness. The second Appellant was questioned by Mr Conroy and Mr Young.
- ⁹⁹⁵⁸ Mr Young called Anne Ritchie, Head of Social Work (Operations), as a witness. Ms Ritchie was questioned about the first Appellant's grievance by Mr Young, Mr Conroy and Members of the Committee.

- ⁹⁹⁵⁹ Mr Young and then Mr Conroy summed up their respective cases in respect of the first Appellant.
- ⁹⁹⁶⁰ Mr Young again called Ms Ritchie as a witness. Ms Ritchie was questioned about the second Appellant's grievance by Mr Young, Mr Conroy and Members of the Committee.
- ⁹⁹⁶¹ Mr Young and then Mr Conroy summed up their respective cases in respect of the second Appellant and thereafter all parties withdrew from the meeting. After the Committee had deliberated the matter in private, all parties were readmitted to the meeting. The parties were advised that the Committee found that the first Appellant's grounds of appeal had not been substantiated and therefore found that the first Appellant's appeal should not be upheld. The parties were further advised that the Committee found that the second Appellant's grounds of appeal had not been substantiated and therefore found that the second Appellant's appeal should not be upheld.
