**Subject: Delivering Better Outcomes And Use Of Joint Resources –
National Evaluation of Community Health Partnerships**

1. Purpose

- 1.1 This report highlights the recently published *Delivering Better Outcomes and Use of Joint Resources* Report (2010 - attached), which both summarises the findings of the Community Health Partnership (CHP) study published in May 2010 and outlines how the Scottish Government will work with its partners to support the further development of CHPs.

2. Background

- 2.1 The CHP study was carried out by Blake Stevenson for the Scottish Government between February 2009 and March 2010. It reviewed overall progress and identified areas of success and areas for improvement. The study re-affirmed the critical role of CHPs in delivering better outcomes for individuals and communities through joint working between partners; and underscored that it will be through the actions taken by primary, community and social care practitioners, working in localities, that NHS Boards and Local Authorities will be able to improve services for communities with fewer resources.
- 2.2 The published Scottish Government response to that study reflects the impact of other streams of work on the future development of CHPs, both published (e.g. the Delivering Quality in Primary Care National Action Plan) and anticipated (e.g. the Audit Scotland Review of CHPs expected in 2011). It also reflects the increasing focus on the benefits of integration between health and social care, set within the broader public sector reform agenda.

- 3.1 The attached paper highlights a range of key issues that are of relevance to the continued organisational and strategic development of West Dunbartonshire CHCP.
