#### **ADJOURNMENT**

Councillor R. McColl, seconded by Councillor J. McColl, moved that the meeting be adjourned until Wednesday, 9 February, 2011 at 6.00 p.m.

Councillor McColl explained that the Scottish Government had indicated that there would be another £5 million made available to 5 local authorities including this Council in respect of supported accommodation funding and that the distribution of this money would be discussed at the Leaders' meeting of Cosla on Friday 28 January 2011. Therefore, in his opinion, it would not be prudent to consider the budget proposals at this meeting as the additional monies could have a major impact on the proposed savings.

At this point Councillor McBride indicated to Provost Agnew that he wished to propose an amendment.

After hearing the Head of Legal, Administrative and Regulatory Services inform the Council that in terms of Standing Order 16 (c) "A motion for adjournment of the meeting may be made at any time (not being in the course of a speech) and will have precedence over all other motions. It will be moved and seconded without discussion and will immediately be put to the meeting." Thereafter, Provost Agnew invited the Council to vote on the proposed adjournment.

On a vote being taken, 14 Members voted in favour of the motion to suspend Standing Orders and none against. Accordingly the meeting adjourned at 2.05 p.m.
