## APPEAL AGAINST DISMISSAL (REF: APP/06/09)

- The Appellant was present and was represented by Peter Veldon of Unison. The Department in which the Appellant had been employed was represented by Raymond Lynch, Solicitor.
- The Appellant and Mr Lynch addressed the Committee on whether a document submitted by the Appellant should be admitted as evidence. The Committee decided that the document should be admitted.
- The Appellant then gave further evidence as did Angela Clements, Head of ICT and Business Development. Ms Clements was questioned by Members of the Committee and the Appellant.
- Mr Lynch and then Mr Veldon summed up their respective cases and thereafter both parties withdrew from the Meeting. After the Committee had deliberated the matter in private, both parties were re-admitted to the Meeting and advised that the grounds of the Appeal had not been substantiated and the Appeal had not been upheld. On behalf of the Committee, the Convener thanked the Appellant for his years of service to the Council and stated that it

was unfortunate that the Appellant's employment had ended in such circumstances.
