Subject: Community Council Grant – Clydebank East Community Council

1. Purpose

1.1 The report provides details of a request for urgent funding received from Clydebank East Community Council which is put forward for Committee approval.

2. Background

- **2.1** In April 2000 Clydebank East Community Council was dissolved due to lack of membership.
- **2.2** Clydebank East Community Council was formed on 8 March 2007. Elections had been scheduled for March 2007 but were not required due to the number of nominations received not exceeding the maximum number of vacancies.

3. Main Issues

- **3.1** The inaugural meeting of this new Community Council will be held on Thursday, 22 March 2007 and Office Bearers, including the post of Treasurer, will be appointed on that date.
- **3.2** The Community Council is requesting a start up grant of £200 to allow them to function until such times as a grant application form can be submitted to the Corporate Services Committee meeting scheduled for June 2007.
- **3.3** There remains a balance of £8,116.25 in the Community Council grants budget for 2006/2007.

5. Financial Implications

5.1 The budget position is noted within point 3 of this report. If recommendations are agreed this would leave an annual budget of:
