Mr Lynch then called as a witness Robert Davidson, Section Head (Catering and Cleaning). Mr Davidson was questioned by Mr Lynch, Mr McDonald, Members of the Committee and again by Mr Lynch.
- Mr McDonald called the Appellant as a witness. The Appellant was questioned by Mr McDonald, Mr Lynch and Members of the Committee.
