EXCLUSION OF PRESS AND PUBLIC

APPEAL AGAINST DISMISSAL (REF: APP/03/04)

- There were submitted background papers relating to an Appeal which had been submitted to the Council in relation to a dismissal. There was also submitted a Note of the procedure to be followed at the Hearing of the Appeal.
- The Appellant was present and was represented by Charlie McDonald of the Transport & General Workers' Union. The department in which the Appellant had been employed was represented by Raymond Lynch, Solicitor.
- Mr Lynch called as witnesses Angus McArthur, Superintendent; William Doyle, Storeman; Stuart Ormond, Contracts Engineer; Charles Harkin, Productivity Officer; Pat Bradley, Personnel Officer; and Ronald Dinnie, Head of Roads, Transport and Commercial Services. The witnesses were questioned by Mr Lynch, Mr McDonald and Members of the Committee and, in the case of Mr Doyle, Mr Ormond and Mr Bradley, were again questioned by Mr Lynch.

- Mr McDonald called as witnesses the Appellant and the Appellant's brother. The Appellant and his brother were questioned by Mr McDonald, Mr Lynch, Members of the Committee and again by Mr McDonald.
- Mr Lynch and then Mr McDonald summed up their respective cases and thereafter both parties withdrew from the meeting. After the Committee had deliberated the matter in private, both parties were re-admitted to the meeting and advised that the grounds of the Appeal had not been substantiated and the Appeal had not been upheld.
