## **JOINT FUTURE: WHOLE SYSTEMS INDICATOR (JPIAF10) 2005 – 2006**

### **Introduction**

I enclose with this letter the base data on JPIAF 10 for the 2005–06 round. Please could partnerships use this to inform their returns on JPIAF 10.

The criteria for evaluation are set out in Annex A to JPIAF circular CCD 5/2005 of 16 December 2005. That circular invited partnerships to describe their understanding and application of the whole system approach, with particular regard to the causes and effects of individual indicators and their interrelationship.

The data attached is in the same form as that for last year. There are 2 tables. The first contains the raw data for the last 3 years and shows pictorially the balance of care. That has been checked out with partnerships by colleagues in our Analytical Services Division. The second is the comparative model showing how the 4 key indicators combine. Partnerships will now be familiar with that pattern.

There are 2 technical changes to the base data.

- We have been advised by ISD that the data on multiple admissions for March 2005 will not be available until the end of March. We therefore used data for December 2002-December 2004 as the closest proxy.

- In past years we estimated the numbers of older people getting intensive home care. The data is now collected routinely as part of the annual H1 return, which is used in 2005 data.  
Partnerships should note that this change has caused some turbulence in the figures in individual areas at this transitional point.

The Whole Systems Indicator Working Group (WSIWG) is looking at the substantive issues raised by partnerships in their last management responses in order to improve the content of the model and make it more meaningful. We expect to introduce some changes in 2006 – 2007, and will consult on them in due course.

Partnerships now have the information to draw up their analysis of the individual indicators and their interrelationships (with particular regard to causes and effects) and their translation into service changes and ultimately into LITs. Please could partnerships report their analysis as part of the JPIAF round generally, by 19 May 2006.
