CHANGE OF CONVENER

- Before commencing with the business of the Meeting, Councillor Maceira informed the Committee that the Council, at its meeting held on 8 February 2007, had appointed him as Convener of the Children's Services Committee and Spokesperson for Education and Cultural Services.

- ¹¹⁵⁰⁷ Thereafter, Councillor Maceira, on behalf of the Committee, thanked Councillor Agnew for his sterling work during his time as Convener of the Committee.

PRESENTATION BY THE HEAD TEACHER OF THE VALE OF LEVEN ACADEMY ON MEASURES TAKEN TO PROMOTE AND RAISE ATTAINMENT AND ACHIEVEMENT FOR PUPILS

- ¹¹⁵⁰⁸ With reference to the Minutes of Meeting of the Children's Services Committee held on 16 November 2005 (Page 2048, paragraph 7549 (3) refers), Councillor Maceira invited Mr Gus Macdonald, Head Teacher of the Vale of Leven Academy (present for this item only) to give a presentation on taking forward attainment and achievement for all pupils of the Vale of Leven Academy.
- In so doing, Mr Macdonald informed the Committee of the work that had taken place in the school year on year in order to ensure that pupils attained the necessary qualifications required for their next steps in either the workplace or further/higher education.
- ¹¹⁵¹⁰ In this respect, a report was submitted by the Director of Education and Cultural Services providing information on the work of the Vale of Leven Academy in taking forward attainment and achievement for all pupils.
- 11511 After discussion and having heard Mr Macdonald in answer to Members' questions, the Committee agreed:-
 - (1) to note the wide range of pupils' achievements which extended beyond academic achievement; and
 - (2) otherwise to note the contents of the report.

THE LOCAL NEGOTIATING COMMITTEE FOR TEACHERS

- ¹¹⁵¹⁴ The Minutes of Meeting of the Local Negotiating Committee for Teachers (LNCT) held on 12 December 2006 were submitted and approved as a correct record.
- ¹¹⁵¹⁵ Ms Cleife informed the Committee that the next meeting of the LNCT would be held on Tuesday, 13 March 2007.

THE RENTON COMMUNITY EDUCATION CENTRE, 30 MAIN STREET, RENTON

- A joint report was submitted by the Director of Education and Cultural Services and the Acting Director of Housing, Regeneration & Environmental Services (Housing & Regeneration Services) seeking approval to declare the Renton Community Education Centre (C.E.C.) surplus to the operational requirements of Education and Cultural Services and making recommendations thereon.
- Having heard the Convener it was noted that Councillor Bollan wished to address the Committee in relation to the future of Renton Community Education Centre. The Committee agreed to hear Councillor Bollan.
- ¹¹⁵¹⁸ Councillor Bollan thanked the Committee for this opportunity and was heard in support of a proposal that the authority transfer the property at nil cost to the Renton Community following obtaining the necessary approval of the Scottish Executive.
- The Convener thanked Councillor Bollan for his presentation and informed the Committee that a letter had been received from Jackie Baillie MSP in support of a continuation to allow consideration of the options in the report and the further option of the transfer at nil value.
- After discussion and having heard the Acting Director of Housing, Regeneration & Environmental Services (Land & Environmental Services) in answer to Members' questions, Councillor Black, seconded by Councillor Brogan, moved:-
- That the Committee should not approve the recommendations but approve Option 2, that is to instruct that negotiations be opened with the Carman Social Inclusion Centre to establish whether this company would be in the position to purchase the property at market value.
- ¹¹⁵²² Following extensive discussion and having heard the Manager of Best Value and Special Projects in response to Members' questions, as an amendment Councillor Maceira, seconded by Councillor Rooney, moved:-
- 11523 That the following recommendations contained within the aforementioned report be approved:-
 - To declare the Community Education Centre at 30 Main Street, Renton, surplus to the operational requirements of Education and Cultural Services.
 - (2) If not required by any other department, the Acting Director of Housing, Regeneration & Environmental Services (Housing & Regeneration Services) be authorised to advertise the Community Education Centre on the open market for disposal for private residential development.

- (3) The Head of Legal and Administrative Services be authorised to conclude this transaction subject to such legal conditions as would be considered appropriate.
- As a further amendment, Councillor Agnew, seconded by Ms Cleife, moved that:-
- The Committee agrees to declare the Community Education Centre at 30 Main Street, Renton surplus to the operational requirements of Education and Cultural Services.
- If not required by any other department, the Acting Director of Housing, Regeneration and Environmental Services (Housing and Regeneration Services) be authorised to advertise the Community Education Centre on the open market for disposal for private residential development and that negotiations be opened with the Carman Social Inclusion Centre to establish whether this company would be in a position to purchase the property at market value.
- 11527 The Head of Legal and Administrative Services be authorised to conclude this transaction subject to such legal conditions as would be considered appropriate.
- After hearing the Manager of Best Value and Special Projects, the Committee agreed to proceed by way of a Roll Call Vote.
- On a vote being taken between the first and second amendments, 5 Members voted for the second amendment (namely Councillor Agnew, Miss Rennie, Miss McBride, Ms Cleife and Ms Allison) and 6 voted for the first amendment (namely Provost Macdonald and Councillors Rooney, Flynn, White, Maceira and Casey). It was noted that Councillor Black and Councillor Brogan abstained.
- On a further vote being taken between the first amendment and the motion, 5 Members voted for the motion (namely Councillors Black and Brogan and Miss Rennie, Miss McBride and Ms Allison) and 8 voted for the first amendment (namely Provost Macdonald, Councillors Rooney, Agnew, Flynn, White, Maceira, Casey and Ms Cleife). Accordingly, the first amendment was declared carried.

 - (3) that a final progress report providing a summary of the progress made and issues addressed in the course of the school session 2006/07, would be submitted to a meeting of the Committee to be held in August 2007.

 - (3) otherwise to note the contents of the report.

PROPOSALS ON SPEND OF ADDITIONAL FUNDS ALLOCATED BY THE SCOTTISH EXECUTIVE
