Depute Provost Linda McColl in the Chair

11798 Councillor Maceira read out a letter informing the Council of the circumstances behind his resignation as Depute Leader of the Council.

11799 Councillor Flynn, seconded by Councillor McDonald, moved:-

Given the changes to Service Spokespersons and the comments made by the former Depute Leader Councillor Maceira regarding the Leader of

the Council, the Council has no confidence in the present post holder.

To that end the Council is asked to consider the positions of the Leader and Depute Leader of the Council and that Councillor Denis Agnew be appointed as Leader of the Council and Councillor Jackie Maceira be

appointed as Depute Leader of the Council.

Following the moving and seconding of the foregoing motion, Councillor Calvert proposed that the Council consider an amendment addressing the positions not only of the Leader and Depute Leader of the Council but also the Council's Service Spokespersons.

- At this stage of the proceedings, the Head of Legal and Administrative Services addressed the Council and indicated that since the Order Paper for the Council made no reference to the Service Spokespersons then Standing Orders would require to be suspended to allow this matter to be addressed as part of the Amendment.
- Councillor Calvert therefore called for Standing Orders to be suspended and on a vote being taken, 7 Members voted in favour of the suspension of standing orders and 12 against. The necessary majority not being attained standing orders were not suspended and accordingly the amendment was not considered by the Council.
- Following the foregoing, it was noted that there was no amendment proposed to the motion and, accordingly, Councillors Agnew and Maceira were appointed as the Council's Leader and Depute Leader respectively.
